To better manage risk, keep people safe and make effective use of limited resources to support people who hoard, their families, communities and workers; adopting a lifespan approach.


We appreciate that we operate in complex systems and need to understand barriers and levers in real life context to inform solutions.





# Questions stakeholders have raised so far....? On infrastructure


- Who in the system can provide the longer-term relationshipbased support?
- What levers can I pull to secure funding for people who hoard? ( from whose budget, for what 'support'?)
- What can be provided/funded by NHS and health? SW? Housing?
   Environmental Health? Etc
- What can we do about variable service levels in different areas (if anything)?
- What does this mean for our planning & commissioning?



# Things to consider.... On supporting workers

#### How can we:

- ensure all stakeholders know 'just enough'?
- provide L&D for those who need to know more; keep them safe?
- find ways to support joined up approaches across stakeholders - to learn together, be more consistent; support shared accountability, manage tensions?
- build in ways to improve services by listening to experts by experience; generate other useful data?
