





Dementia awareness and training for housing staff

There are around 90,000 people in Scotland living with dementia and this number is expected to increase significantly as our population ages. We know that the right housing and support can make a big difference in helping people to live well with dementia.

The majority of people with dementia live in mainstream housing, not in specialist housing or care homes, so everyone who works in the housing sector can play a part in improving housing outcomes for people living with dementia and their family or carers.

We think that every member of staff should have at least a basic awareness of what dementia is and what they can do to help – that includes every role from customer service to repairs and maintenance. Some staff will need more tailored, in-depth training depending on their role.

These tables include details of a range of training options for housing staff at different levels from providers operating in Scotland. Understanding the impact of sight loss when living with dementia	Many people living with dementia may also experience sight loss making day to day activities more challenging. This can increase the risk of disorientation, trips and falls, and contribute to the loss of independence. The Royal National Institute of Blind People (RNIB) offer a range of introductory courses which can help housing staff understand the impacts of sight loss and how environments can be adapted to support people living with dementia and sight loss.
