#### Right to rent

A <u>new blog from John Perry</u> about the extension of the right to rent scheme to Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland. The Joint Council for the Welfare of Immigrants has contacted the Home Office to ask them to publish a full evaluation of the policy to demonstrate its efficacy, cost effectiveness and non-discriminatory nature before it is rolled out more widely.

#### Influencing on the ground

Since the last edition of Focus on Influencing, we've attended a variety of meetings and events - here's a sample to give you a sense of the kind of activities we engage in on your behalf:

#### **Northern Ireland**

The work of the CIH Northern Ireland welfare changes and housing forum continues – it will shortly publish a report recommending realistic and achievable changes to housing and social security policy in Northern Ireland, which could help to make housing more affordable and housing provision more viable.

## **CIH** Ireland

CIH Ireland hosted a major conference – Making the rental strategy work – in conjunction with the Department of Housing, Planning, Communities, and Local Government. The future of the Irish rental sector was debated by delegates and a wide range of speakers – Maria Bailey T.D., chair of the Oireachtas Joint Committee on Housing, Planning, Community and Local Government, told the crowd of over



100 housing industry experts from Ireland and the UK that housing associations should provide rented accommodation on a non-profit basis, in addition to traditional social housing. Find out more <u>here</u>.

### Scotland

CIH Scotland has commissioned research in partnership with the Scottish Government to assess the impact of introducing local housing allowance (LHA) caps to the social rented sector for young people in Scotland. A summary of the interim, findings has been published and is available <u>online</u>. It shows that around 21,000 single people under the age of 35 could face £22.6 million annual shortfall in rent due to the proposals. The research team are now conducting interviews with social landlords to explore options for mitigation. The final report will be published in the summer.

In the run up to the 2017 local council elections, CIH Scotland launched its 'Handle on housing' campaign featuring a <u>hanger</u> which members could display at their front door, encouraging them to ask five key questions of prospective canvassing candidates. This was accompanied by a <u>housing fact sheet</u> to help get the conversation started and a round up of each party's key housing and related <u>manifesto</u> <u>pledges</u>.

CIH Scotland is currently working on responses to consultations on Scotland's Energy Efficiency Programme and the Future of Energy in Scotland, and CIH Scotland members were encouraged to contribute their views by completing an online member survey. The responses to both consultations will be published on our <u>website</u> in due course. Other public consultations which CIH Scotland will be responding to include a call for <u>evidence</u> from the Scottish Parliament on homelessness, guidance on engaging communities in decisions relating to land, and energy efficiency and conditions standards in private rented housing.

#### Wales

- CIH Cymru provided oral evidence to the Equalities, Community and Local Government committee at the Welsh Assembly on the abolition of the right to buy in Wales. In providing evidence Matt Dicks and Matt Kennedy highlighted the need to protect the supply of social housing in Wales and highlighted evidence provided by members on the local impact of the policy and modern day housing management challenges.
- CIH Cymru has once again joined the Homes for Wales coalition to support a joint, focussed campaign highlighting the need to re-look at welfare policy and ensure a well-resourced construction sector following Brexit. The coalition has jointly arranged a hustings event due to take place on May 23rd in Cardiff with spokespeople from the main parties due to appear.
