Net Zero by 2045

- The Scottish Parliament has committed to Scotland becoming a net zero emissions country, society and economy by 2045.
- The Scottish Government estimates changing the type of heating used in over two million homes.
- Net zero is going to have an impact on social housing, particularly where we are relying on gas to meet existing standards.



EESSH1/EESSH2 and **EPCs**

- Both EESSH milestones are based on EPCs
- Already issues about whether SAP works for every house/heating system
- We know that SG is reviewing EPCs
- Some of the flexibility in EESSH might be lost if we have to meet a cross-tenure standard, or a whole building standard for tenements, based on whatever replaces EPCs



Managing the transition

- EESSH2 review and the ZEST recommendations
- Uncertainty about some solutions
- Area/whole building solutions
- Uncertainty about the costs and benefits
- Unintended impacts, such as reduced air quality
- Importance of involving tenants in the decisions



What should we do?

 Right now, we should make sure we understand what is possible with our homes, what it would cost and how much difference it would make – that has to be the basis for planning future investment
